The members of the Punjab Association wanted to create a lasting legacy that would impact society positively and what better way to do it than begin an institution of higher learning exclusively for women students. Anna Adarsh College for Women was the result of this visionary thinking of Punjab Association. Established as a college to cater to the educational needs of girls in and around the locale of Anna Nagar, the college had just 300 students and 17 faculty with 6 departments. The tiny sapling has today grown into a huge sheltering banyan with 5300 students and 200 faculty.15 UG,10PG, 3 Research and 4 language departments.13 certificate courses on various specializations are offered on practical aspects of learning.

The reward for work well done is the opportunity to do more

The awarding of the prestigious A+ grade by the National Accreditation and Assessment Council was the result of meticulous documentation and tremendous hard work. This award has pushed us to perform better and utilize every single opportunity to grow. The college was placed among the top 100 in the country in NIRF rating of the Ministry of HRD, Government of India



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and was also recognized by the reputed national magazine Outlook as among the top 10 colleges in the city. The College has been selected by NAAC as a mentor institution to help other institutions understand the parameters of grading and work towards NAAC accreditation. The initiative by the management, Adarsh IAS is aimed at training the students for civil services examination to produce leaders of eminence.

The will to win, the desire to succeed, the urge to reach your full potential... these are the keys that will unlock the door to personal excellence.

Students reach peak performance in the university exams and this is seen in the number of ranks garnered each year. This year we had 207 ranks that included 11 university first ranks. The pass percentage was 94 for UG and 97 for PG.

Learning never exhausts the mind

Our faculty members are an energetic and dynamic lot because they keep learning through various means. They share knowledge and look for avenues for enriching their existing expertise. 16 senior professors are on the Board of Studies of leading universities and colleges. Faculty Development programmes were attended by 143 faculty and 27 serve as subject experts and sit on interview panels, while 34 have been resource persons in other institutions.

Qualification is a reflection of competency. 98% of faculty have their eligibility approval from the university of Madras. This is a commendable achievement since we are a private arts and science college.

Anna Adarsh College was the recipient of VidyaSevaRatna award for promoting the cause of education for women empowerment from the KanchiKamakoti Trust. In recognition of the immense talent pool of students that the college has fostered, the 'Kalvi Thai Peedam Award' was bestowed on the institution by Kaviarasu Tamil Sangam in 2018. The principal participated in a conference on autonomy in Hyderabad organized by UGC for select Heads of leading institutions with excellent NAAC scores in 2019. Faculty members have been recognized for



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their subject skills, administrative abilities and for the social service rendered.

To complement classroom teaching and to supplement it with applied knowledge, the departments conduct a host of programmes throughout the year. The various clubs shape the skills and mold the mindset of students and help their inherent light of ability shine through. Students learn to discover their talents and also serve society. The service clubs inculcate a sense of responsible citizenship with a committed social outlook amongst the students. The NSS, YRC and Rotract have been involved in activities for community welfare throughout the year. The NSS unit of the college adopted Vaniyanchavadi village and the yearly camp was conducted there for the benefit of the community. The Rotaract Club has been instrumental in releasing a special stamp by India Post, Govt of India recognizing the institution's commitment towards empowering young women through holistic education.

The total number of all events and programmes organized and conducted by the college is an impressive count of 231.

The outreach programmes look at student service to the community in meaningful ways. Periodic visits to orphanages, old age homes, institutes for the differently abled have students imbue the notion of reaching out to the disadvantaged section of the community. Institutional social responsibility programmes were conducted including multiple blood donation and organ donation camps, awareness rallies, sensitization programmes etc. Students went on a door-to-door campaign as Ambassadors to persuade the public to exercise their voting rights. Their efforts were appreciated by the Corporation of Chennai.

This year, with the theme 'Retro' students got an opportunity to reimagine and recreate the past. Neharika was a crowd puller with 120 students from other colleges and universities taking part.

We are environmentally conscious and have eco-friendly measures in place. We voluntarily undertook the green audit to assess the environmentally conscious steps employed on campus. Rain water is harvested for replenishing ground water. All the paper waste generated is recycled in partnership with ITC Paper division through their wealth through waste project. and roof top solar PV module power panels provide a renewable source of power.

The elected student council leaders are groomed to take up responsibilities and make decisions. The students are not nominated but elected through an e-voting system which was developed inhouse. Every single of the 5300 students vote to elect their council leaders. We are proud of the fact that the college believes and stands by the principles of people power at the micro level here.

Sport gives players an opportunity to know and test themselves.

Students at Anna Adarsh work on an open selection where interested students are tested and selected for special coaching which happens in the two sessions – morning and evening. Professional coaching is given in handball, volleyball, ball badminton, Kho-kho among other sports. There is emphasis on fitness for performance and students are trained in silambam,



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karate, Zumba and yoga. Sports day was an enjoyable and colourful event with competitions, demonstrations, drills and displays.

The college is proud of its sporting accomplishments. Sports Day was celebrated on 23rd January with excitement and fun, with competitions and colourful displays. Sporten, the intercollegiate sporting event held on 25th February was a success with 60 players participating in team sporting events. The university, in recognition of the institution's commitment towards sports, has appointed the Principal as the chairperson and the Physical Director as Convenor for zone B women's tournament, University of Madras.

Collaborations with other institutions such as universities, colleges, research and academic bodies help in knowledge exchange, enabling us to teach and learn in the process. The Internal Quality Assessment Cell is the apex body for organizing and coordinating all events. It synchronizes the activities of the college in tune with the objectives of the institution. Assessing processes, laying down procedures, systematic documentation and implementing feedback suggestions are functions taken up by the IQAC. The academic audit will be held on 13th March this year.
