The legacy of Punjab Association began with a handful of committed citizens who established their powerful yet compassionate presence in philanthropy, social work and education. Anna Adarsh College for Women was born out of this visionary zeal of the Punjab Association in 1980. The college started out with just a small group of committed faculty and eager students in the early years and today our growth is evidenced by numbers - 5000 plus students, 200 faculty offering more than 20 courses. In addition, there are 64 certificate, value-added courses and two diploma courses.

This year was a transition year for the faculty and students.
