S. NO	FEEDBACK	ACTION TAKEN
1	Few parents felt that their wards have less time to visit the canteen.	Apart from the canteen the college arranged for two cafeterias one each on the ground floor and second floor.
2	A handful of parents felt the need for improvement in their ward's skills and knowledge to face the corporate world.	The college conducted Skill Enhancement & Personality Development classes through SEA for all the years. Every department offered Addon/Certificate courses in various fields of interest. Internship was made compulsory for all the students after 1 year.
3	Parents also felt that the college infrastructure can be improved to some extent.	Students' desks were replaced with state of art desks. Entire building was given a facelift with a colour wash.

1	Students must be taught real life skills and trained to crack competitive exams.	Regular seminars and workshops are conducted on clearing competitive exams.
2	Additional courses must be added to enhance the skills of students beyond syllabus.	53 Addon/Value added certificate courses were introduced in various fields of subjects for students across all departments.
3	Use of the latest ICT technologies to make learning engaging and entertaining.	The staff ensure that they upskill themselves through FDPs and Workshops on digital learning and try to use various online tools in teaching and assessment of students. LCD facilities were provided in 52 classrooms for this purpose.

S.NO	FEEDBACK	ACTION TAKEN
1	The staff felt that quality publication was lacking due to high publication cost in UGC CARE & Scopus Journals.	Through Financial Sponsorship Policy, the management reimburses 50% of the cost of publication and paper presentation.
2	Staff felt the need for LCD in the day-to-day teaching learning process.	Every department was provided with an LCD projector in at least one classroom in case of UG departments and two classrooms in case of PG departments.
3	Majority of the staff suggested the necessity of enhancing knowledge on NAAC and NIRF parameters for better understanding as the institution was awaiting Peer Team Visit.	IQAC organized various webinars, seminars, and workshops through renowned and eminent persons from IQAC clusters and other colleges to understand NAAC & NIRF parameters.
4	The faculty suggested providing medical benefits in the form of insurance schemes for staff.	The Management initiated medical insurance for all staff and their immediate family members. Medical insurance cards were issued to this effect.

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
