



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



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



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



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



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


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



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



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



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



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



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ANALYSIS OF STUDENTS SATISFACTION SURVEY 2023-2024

- 58% of the students confirmed that 85-100% of the syllabus was covered during the class sessions.
- **59%** of the students felt that their teachers were thoroughly prepared for the classes.
- 75% of the students agreed that their teachers always communicated effectively.
- 60% of the students commended their teachers' approach to teaching as excellent.
- 66% of the students opined that their teachers were always fair in the internal evaluation process.
- 66% of the students stated that their performance in assignments was discussed with them.
- 67% of the students acknowledged the college's efforts in actively supporting internships, field visits, and other experiential learning opportunities.
- 58% of the students felt that the teaching and mentoring process at Anna Adarsh College for Women significantly facilitated their cognitive, social, and emotional growth.
- 60% of the students confirmed that the college provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.



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- 66% of the students acknowledged that their teachers consistently informed them about the expected competencies, course outcomes, and program outcomes.
- 67% of the students felt that their mentors actively followed up on assigned tasks.
- 70% of the students appreciated the use of teaching methods that involved practical examples and applications.
- 65% of the students reported that their teachers identified their strengths and encouraged them by providing appropriate challenges.
- 63% of the students stated that their teachers recognized their weaknesses and offered support to help them overcome these challenges.
- 61% of the students felt that they were actively engaged in monitoring, reviewing, and contributing to the continuous improvement of the teaching-learning process.
- 63% of the students expressed that their teachers extensively used student-centric methods in teaching.
- 65% of the students agreed that they were encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities.



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- 71% of the students acknowledged the college's efforts in inculcating soft skills and life skills, which help them become employable and ready for the real world.
- 57% of the students confirmed that at least 90% of the teachers used ICT tools for teaching.
- 62% of the students strongly agreed that the overall quality of the teaching-learning process was very good.

SUGGESTIONS FOR IMPROVEMENT

- o Extend library hours to accommodate students' study needs.
- o Ensure restrooms are cleaned regularly and maintained in hygienic conditions.
- o Introduce more courses focused on skill enhancement and personality development.
- Organize educational trips for final-year students to provide experiential learning opportunities.
- o Improve and expand the drinking water facilities on campus.
- Promote the adequate and consistent use of ICT tools in the teaching-learning process.
- Increase opportunities for internships and field visits to enhance practical exposure.
